
An Indigenous Australian Lullaby also known as 'Inanay Capuana'

Inanay


Inanay is a beautiful Indigenous Australian Lullaby also known as 'Inanay Capuana', in the Yorta Yorta language. Most likely from Torres Strait Islands, the song is part of a songline also known as a 'Dreaming Track'.

No direct translation can be found and the exact meaning is unknown, however the song is believed to be a lullaby or a children's song. A possible fun translation describes the song to be about walking through the bush and shooing away a goanna (a monitor lizard found in the Australian countryside).

Gtr 4 Tune String 6 down to D.


Explanation for the Gtr 3 Percussion: Bars 14-24 and Bars 51-61:

Important: Block the strings with the left hand. Gentle percussion.



Explanation for the Gtr 2 Percussion: Bars 29-35:

Important: Block the strings with the left hand. Gentle percussion.
